Tour de Fronds Directions June 18, 2016

From the Riddle exit, go west 28 miles. This follows Cow Creek upstream into BLM land, winding but little elevation gain.

Turn right onto Dutch Henry road (3 miles past the West Fork road intersection). Go 8 miles up Dutch Henry road, climbing to a saddle at 2300 feet elevation. This is the aid station and turnaround point for the "Cruiser Century" route.

Other people set up and operate the aid station. The ham writes down the time and number of each arriving cyclist and reports that to net control. There are occasional questions, messages for the aid workers and organizers. No cell phone service-ham radio is the only link.

Be set up by 10 AM. Shut down after confirming with Arrasta Saddle that nobody else is coming. Can probably tear down by 2:30. Bring chair, maybe a table, clipboard, water, food. The aid station should be in a shady area. Very quiet most of the time.
